



Our Story

King's Academy Christian School has successfully operated since August 1999 and was supported by Christ the King Church (CTK). Under the dynamic leadership of Reverend John W. McVicker, Sr., Pastor of CTK, King's Academy Christian School was founded. It was his vision to provide all children with an opportunity to receive the best education possible with a Christ-centered curriculum. Thus, Pastor McVicker gave the task of organizing the school to his wife, Mrs. Marilyn McVicker in 1998.

Mrs. McVicker selected a committee that developed a plan for organizing the school. Support from the CTK membership and a 2-year grant from the Helen Bader Foundation allowed King's Academy Christian School to open its doors with 12 students in 1999. A growth plan was developed which included the Milwaukee Parental School Choice Program. During the 10 years as a Private/Choice school we expanded our grades to include K4 through 8th grade. We also received accreditation from Christian Schools International.

We continued our mission to provide excellence in education and increase the academic achievement of even more students by transitioning to a City of Milwaukee Charter School in the fall of 2010.

Although King's Academy experienced five years as a Charter School, because of the strong religious beliefs, the school, with tremendous support from Christ the King Baptist Church, has re-established its original intent to assist families in the academic, spiritual, physical, social and emotional needs of children.

As stated in our vision statement, we believe Matthew 19:14 NIV, which reads, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these." Our staff is committed to educating all students to the highest level of academic achievement regardless of family background, race, Socio-economic level or gender.

Our current enrollment is over 189 students in K4 through 8th grade with over 23 staff members.

Parent involvement is paramount in accomplishing our vision and mission. Our data shows that 86% of our parents are involved in the education of their children.

As our story continues we are committed to our mission to educate all children and prepare them to live Christian lives by promoting academic excellence with a curriculum that will motivate, educate and elevate our students to become productive citizens.
